## AIM AND PURPOSE

The aim and purpose of GCSE Photography in the school curriculum is that it enables students to investigate the world from a social/cultural perspective through researching, studying different artists and applying artist's ideas to their own personal lives and thoughts. GCSE Photography promotes discipline and independent creative thinking due to the ongoing research and idea developments that take place. Through experimenting with a variety of mediums and technology, students are also able to have skills that could be beneficial within the workplace.

## HOW DOES THE CURRICULUM INDUCT STUDENTS INTO THE DISCIPLINE OF THE SUBJECT?

In Year 10, students are introduced to a subject theme and will build a portfolio of work with the teacher's guidance. This will involve being introduced to the subject through looking at the formal elements which enable students to understand the technical attributes of the course. From this, students will then do focused artist studies relating to an aspect of photography such as 'light', 'drawing' and 'portraiture'. Creating focused artist studies allows students to take inspiration from an artist, develop work practically from using photoshop or other creative techniques/skills and finally being able to work through a portfolio of work to complete an outcome.
